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Ministry Research Project

Three complete draft-copies of the research project must be submitted to the Director of the Doctoral Program by **January 30th** (for May graduation) for review by the Examination Committee.

The Dissertation Committee (Academic Dean, Director of the Doctoral Program, Primary Supervisor) will decide whether the dissertation research project is ready for defense, and if it is, they will determine (**before February 30th**) the time for the defense.

The research project must be successfully presented and defended in a face-to-face oral examination (viva voce) before the Examination Committee (determined by the Dissertation Committee and consisting of at least one external, credentialed scholar) **at least thirty days prior** to the anticipated graduation.

The project writing must conform to the format and bibliographical style requirement in A Manual for Writers of Term Papers, Theses, and Dissertations, by Kate L. Turabian (latest edition).
